3. Agreements with the Commission on Economic Opportunity

- e. Commission on Economic Opportunity, Inc. to run an alternative suspension and mentoring program from July 1, 2007 through June 30, 2008. Remuneration for said program shall be \$170,000 (Addendum VIII).
