6. <u>Standardization for Direct Digital Controls Systems (DDC)</u>

RESOLUTION:

WHEREAS, the District wishes to maintain its heating, ventilating, and air conditioning (HVAC) systems operating in a safe, efficient manner; and the District wishes to control these systems through a computer-based Building Management System (BMS), also known as a Direct Digital Control System (DDC); and

WHEREAS, the District has installed Building Management Systems in several of its schools manufactured by Johnson Controls, Incorporated and wishes to expand these systems to improve the operating efficiency of the HVAC in all of its schools; and

WHEREAS, the components of a total BMS are linked by a computer network and must be compatible if they are to operate as designed and to introduce components of a BMS manufactured by others would negatively affect the compatibility and system integrity of the BMS;

WHEREAS, the District has trained its maintenance staff in the computer control language of the Johnson Controls, Incorporated Metasys® BMS;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that for reasons of efficiency and economy and pursuant to the authority conferred by Subdivision 5 of Section 103 of the General Municipal Law, it is determined by this Board that there is a need for the standardization in the purchase, installation, and commissioning of its BMS system components. The District will standardize on the BMS system components as manufactured by Johnson Controls, Incorporated.
