I. MEETING CALLED TO ORDER

III. EXECUTIVE SESSION

At approximately 6:05 pm Mr. Mayo made a motion to enter into Executive Session for the purpose of discussing personnel matters. This was seconded by Mr. Schofield and the vote carried: 9–0. Mr. McCarthy, Mr. Hopke, Ms. O'Neill and Ms. Culligan were also in attendance at the Executive Session.

IV. MOVE TO PUBLIC SESSION

At approximately 7:05 pm, the members of the Board of Education reconvened into Public Session.

V. <u>SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT</u>

- The True North Troy Preparatory Charter School is required to notify the public that it is seeking to add an elementary component. No public comments were made.
- School 18 student Carlos Duffie recently saved his family in a fire. Carlos was honored by Tom Mayo and the Board of Education for his bravery.
- There has been significant progress in the DMS projects. There will be a special meeting of the Facilities Committee on November 10th. At December 2nd BOE meeting, there will be a resolution to bring a referendum to the taxpayers for vote in January 2010.
- DMS has offered a flu clinic in the past to inoculate all staff. However, we cannot guarantee there will be enough shots for everyone.
- District calendar shows Christmas Eve district offices are closed. This will be determined by the Board of Education.

VI. <u>COMMITTEE REPORTS</u>

- a. <u>Education Committee</u> Mary Marro-Giroux reported on the October 7th meeting. Julianne Giacone presented on PreK curriculum. The DMS master schedule, Odyssey of the Mind advisors, GED program and enrollment figures were discussed.
- b. <u>Policy and Planning Committee</u> Mary Ellen Adams, Chair, reported on the October 21st meeting. Business policies were updated from 1991 and six policies will be voted on at tonight's meeting. The succession of Board members and credit card policies were also discussed.
- c. <u>Finance Committee</u> Stephanie Scully, Chair, reported on the October 28th meeting. The Board received financial reports. A first draft of the budget was received and budget hearing date has been changed to May 5th. Strategies have been discussed to get the public more involved in the budget process.
- d. <u>Facilities Committee</u> Anne Wager-Rounds, Chair, reported on October 28th meeting. Tetra Tech reviewed the background of the DMS reconstruction project. A pre-referendum scheduled was discussed. The BOE is committed to addressing the problems at DMS. There will be a special Facilities meeting on November 10th and the public is encouraged to attend.

- Anne McEnaney (DMS teacher) Teachers are very concerned about safety in the halls.

3. <u>SEQRA Resolution Issuing a SEQRA Negative Declaration for the Renovation, Upgrading</u> and Improvement of School District Buildings in and for The Enlarged City School District of <u>Troy, Rensselaer County, New York.</u> (Addendum III)

BE IT RESOLVED, by not less than three-fifths of the total voting strength of the Board of Education of the City School District of the City of Troy, Rensselaer County, New York (the "Board"), as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>. The "Project" consists of the following: Exterior improvements at Exhibition stadium, including new synthetic turf field or renovation of natural turf, new field lighting with spill-lightcontrol fixtures, new or renovated concession stand, toilet rooms, ticket booth, ADA accessibility improvements, miscellaneous fencing, renovation and improvements of existing running track, new walks, correction of identified drainage problems and new accessory home bleacher; improvements at Varsity Baseball and Softball fields, including new backstops, sideline and outfield fencing, new dugouts, new bleachers and irrigation upgrades; improvements at Junior Varsity Baseball and Softball fields, including turf renovation, new backstops and sideline fencing and correction of drainage problems; other associated site work and new tennis courts.

The Project will also include miscellaneous interior renovations and upgrades within the Middle School and High School. These include general construction work, HVAC, Electrical and Plumbing upgrades.

<u>Section 2</u>. Pursuant to Article 8 of the Environmental Conservation Law of the State of New York, as amended, and Title 6, Part 617.3 of the New York Codes, Rules and Regulations ("NYCRR") implementing Article 8 (collectively referred to hereinafter as "SEQRA"), the Board may not undertake, fund or approve the Project until it has complied with the provisions of SEQRA.

Section 3. Pursuant to SEQRA, the Board is required to make a determination with respect to the environmental impact(s) of the Project.

<u>Section 4</u>. To aid the Board in determining whether the Project may have a significant effect upon the environment, an Environmental Assessment Form ("EAF") was prepared, and copies of said EAF are on file in the office of the Board and are readily accessible to the public.

Section 5. The Board has undertaken a coordinated SEQRA review of the Project.

<u>Section 6</u>. As a result of its careful review and examination of the Project and associated documentation, the Board finds that, on balance and after careful consideration of all relevant documentation, it has adequate information to evaluate all of the relevant benefits and potential impacts.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the members of the Board of Education of the Enlarged City School District of Troy, as follows:

(1) Based upon its review of the Project description, plans and supporting documentation, as it has deemed appropriate, the criteria contained in 6 NYCRR §617.7(c), and based further upon the Board's knowledge of the area surrounding the Project, and such further investigation of the Project and its environmental effects as the Board has deemed appropriate, the Board makes the following findings and determinations with respect to the Project pursuant to SEQRA:

(a) The Project consists of the components described above and constitutes a "project" as such term is defined in the Act;

(b) The Project constitutes an "Unlisted Action" (as said quoted term is defined in SEQRA);

(c) The Board has engaged in an appropriate environmental review of the Project;

(d) The Project will not have a significant effect on the environment, and the Board will not require the preparation of an Environmental Impact Statement with respect to the Project; and

(e) As a consequence of the foregoing, the Board has prepared a Negative Declaration with respect to the Project, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit "A", which shall be filed in the office of the Board in a file that is readily accessible to the public, and published pursuant to the requirements of SEQRA.

(2) A copy of this Resolution, together with the attachments hereto, shall be placed on file in the office of the Board, where the same shall be available for public inspection during business hours.

(3) The Director of Management Services is hereby authorized and directed to distribute copies of this Resolution and to do such further things or perform such acts as may be necessary or convenient to implement the provisions of this Resolution.

(4) The Board hereby authorizes the Director of Management Services to sign the Negative Declaration on the Board's behalf and distribute copies thereof in accordance with SEQRA.

(5) This Resolution shall take effect immediately.
