### VII. PUBLIC INPUT ON AGENDA AND NON-AGENDA ITEMS

Stacey Sadowski (School 14/THS parent) - saw district report cards and we are doing great.
Building condition surveys were comprehensive. Police in our schools are very important.
Rosemary Colts (parent and employee) - She was aware of student who had to change to a new school and was not welcomed. Sunset Program has been very successful thanks to Mr. Carmello.

•Maria Holmes (DMS parent/graduate) - She was scared as a new student at DMS. Resource officers help students and are important for safe environment.

•Bob Fitzgerald (President of Troy Police Benevolent Association) - In response to newspaper article, resource officers are only at schools when school is in session. It is not a contractual issue. Resource officers solve problems before problems esculate onto the streets. It would be helpful to contact Mayor with parents' concerns.

•Mr. Schofield stated parents could let City Council know their concerns at Council meeting on Thursday.

•Sandra Brown (guardian) - her grandson has had an excellent experience at School 18. The school is very diversified and high-performing.

•Colleen Bisceglia (School 18 parent) - response to newspaper article regarding enrollment number at School 18. She feels numbers have been manipulated.

•Alison Collins Schroeder (School 18 parent) - her child is receiving an excellent education at School 18. She has collected test score data and provided BOE with copy of document. Test scores should override other factors.

•Jeannie Steigler (THS parent) - Her children were part of re-districting in '90's and it was hard but children did well. BOE members who have a child in particular school should recuse themselves from final vote to eliminate biases.

•Eileen Hickey (School 18 teacher) - In response to article, School 18 has consistently done well and surpassed test scores. Education should be a factor because students do not get a second chance. District should duplicate School 18 success with other buildings.
