IV. PUBLIC SESSION

At 7:30 pm, Mrs. Wager-Rounds called the public meeting to order with the Pledge of Allegiance.

V. DISTRICT COMMUNITY ANNOUNCEMENTS

Mrs. Wager-Rounds and Ms. Walsh attended an Art Show at School 1. She invited the public to see the Freedom Wall designed by School 1 students. Congratulations to THS Softball Team who won regional game at Potsdam. Mrs. Wager-Rounds thanked the Troy Booster Club for a wonderful Varsity Awards Banquet.

VI. CAPITAL PROJECT UPDATE

Marc Rivers of U.W. Marx and Kersten Lorcher of Mosaic Associates gave an update on the Capital Project at the Middle School. Photos were shown of the new Media Center and Troy Room, Special Education classroom in the 8th grade wing, cafeteria and new seating in the Auditorium. The canopy of the entrance is complete. Mrs. Wager-Rounds would like to add ground signage for "Troy Middle School" identical to Troy High's. Mrs. Harvin stated was very pleased and U.W. Marx has done an excellent job.

VII. PRINCIPAL'S PRESENTATION

Mr. Joseph Mariano, Principal of Troy High School, gave a powerpoint presentation. He thanked the Board for the opportunity to boast about THS students. Mr. Mariano is working to make THS a place where all students are inspired to achieve success. The school report card has been released for last school year and AYP has been met for all targets; he is very proud of the overall accountability rate. Last year 81 percent of students graduated and we have to improve upon this. Programs help make this possible such as AIS, co-teaching in integrated classrooms, transitions program, Sponsor-a-Scholar, Sunset School and Alternative Learning Program. Troy continues with community partnerships and he is exploring other opportunities. There has been great success in the athletic program with several Scholar/Athlete Teams awarded.

VIII. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Dr. Brian Howard, Interim Superintendent of Schools, recalled the events of 2010-11 school year and an unfocused governing body. He discussed accomplishments as of June 2013 with a vision and mission, successful lobbying efforts and raised expectations. He thanked the BOE for allowing him to be apart of this. Dr. Howard advised the Board to review and revisit the roles of the Superintendent and BOE, create timelines for transportation, charter schools, safety committee and School Improvement Grant implementation. The Board's focus must remain on the students. Dr. Howard said he was going to miss his position at Troy but is looking forward to a new era and excited by the new leadership.
