I. MEETING CALLED TO ORDER

At 6:15 pm Mr. Schofield called the meeting to order.

III. EXECUTIVE SESSION

Mr. Schofield made a motion to move to Executive Session regarding a pending litigation. Invited in were Mr. Carmello, Mrs. Miaksi and Ms. Ahearn.

IV. PUBLIC SESSION

At 6:05 pm Mr. Schofield called the meeting to order with the Pledge of Allegiance.

V. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Mr. Carmello stated there was an incident last week at an elementary building involving some Troy High athletes related to Homecoming activities. Mr. Carmello reminded the Board and the public that ability to participate in athletics and extracurricular activities is a privilege, not a right. We hold our athletes to a high standard. They are role models to their peers and ambassadors of the Troy CSD when they are in the community. Those who were involved in the events disregarded their responsibilities as Troy athletes and their actions do not reflect who we are as a District or our student body. All those involved will be held accountable for their actions which violated the Code of Conduct and Athletic Code of Conduct. We understand that young adults sometimes make mistakes; we will use this as a learning experience for those student athletes and our school community will be stronger for it.

VI. PUBLIC INPUT ON AGENDA AND NON-AGENDA ITEMS

- (1) Zak Johnson (THS football player) He is one of many students who participated in annual Homecoming activities. He apologizes that his actions and takes responsibility for them. He understand he has upset others. He asked that the Board give him the same consequences as the other students and re-consider his suspension of 2 football games. He accepts 1 game suspension; however, all other students received 1 game suspension. He has been singled-out and does not know why. He should be treated equally and fairly with the same punishment as the other students and not be the only student sitting out 2 games. He did drive on the grass but did not tear up the grass or destroy any property. He did not steal toilet paper, he did not throw food. Troy CSD stated they treat each child equally and fairly. He is asking the Board to give him the same consequences as other students.
- (2) Michelle Ninstant (parent of THS student Zak Johnson) She stated that she holds her son accountable and her son has received consequences at home. She met with Assistant Principal Mr. Stiles to ask specifically why he was given him a different punishment. She was told because Zac drove on the grass. Her son did not destroy property, throw food, trash or steal supplies. She is asking that her son should be treated fairly with the same consequences as the other students. Please re-consider his 2 game suspensions and allow him to have the same consequences as other students. Each child should be treated equally and fairly; her son should not be singled-out any more or any less than the other students.
- (3) Martha Thomas (parent of THS students Elijah and Isaiah Thomas) Her son has not only been suspended but also kicked off the football team. He spoke to the coach and has been berated by the Athletic Director. He has been told to ride a different bus. She would like to point out that this has been a long tradition of Homecoming activities and many of our kids have done this over the years and no one has complained. No parents complained. Coaches know students do this, but no one told the students not to do this. It has been done for years. Football players and cheerleaders offered to clean up the mess. There was no vandalism. The coach has removed my two sons from the team and it is their senior year. My son planned to play football in college. She feels the coach is trying to destroy his career. She doesn't think this is right.

- (4) Patrick Zacaro (Taxpayer) His three grown children have gone through Troy Schools and now his grandchildren. He and his wife founded the Parent Club many years ago and his is a supporter of the football program. He would support Zak's punishment being reduced to 1 game; it was courageous for him to speak tonight and apologize. It would be good to re-instate the other players also. Regardless of your decision on tonight's matter, he commends the Mr. Mariano and the Superintendent on their academics.
- (5) Isaiah Thomas (THS football player) He has stated he has taken part in homecoming tradition each year and did not think it was a big deal. He feels that he and the others were disrespected by the Athletic Director by not allowing them to ride the bus or wearing their jerseys. Coach did not give us a chance to talk. Football is his life; it has been taken away from him. Please look into this situation and allow him back on the team; he does not think it is fair.

Following public comment period, Mr. Carmello stated that students should follow protocol; set up a meeting with Mr. Reinisch and Mr. Mariano over the next few days. He added that some of the statements made tonight [during public comment] were inaccurate.
