III. EXECUTIVE SESSION

At 6:00 pm Mr. Schofield called the meeting to order. School 14 student Rosie Sanchez led the Pledge of Allegiance.

VI. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Mr. Carmello had nothing to report at this time.

VII. SCHOOL 14 PRINCIPAL'S PRESENTATION - K. CLOUTIER

Principal Karen Cloutier gave a power point presentation regarding School 14. As Troy School District is a district on rise, School 14 is climbing to the top! She highlighted what's new at School 14: 26 class sections; 577 students (largest in the district); 419 families; 81 students new to School 14 (School Choice or Ark students); 74 students with disabilities; 28 ELL and 15 homeless.

School 14 is following a new master schedule under Dr. Watson's leadership; common goal is that all students will be successful with high expectations; we can teach the whole child. NYS testing scores at Level 3 have doubled in both ELA and Math. Level 1's decreased, all grades in both ELA and Math either met or exceeded the district average.

District Goal 1 to increase scores by 20% - developing actions plans; District Goal 2 regarding Code of Conducts -referrals have decreased, outstanding PBIS program with many reinforcements of positive behavior.

Mrs. Cloutier recognized teacher Karen Martin who is retiring this month.

VIII. TREASURER'S REPORT - K. CIETEK

<u>October Financials</u> - Kathleen Cietek, District Treasurer, reported on that the majority of budget transfers were salary-related. The internal claims auditor, Ken Terry, reviewed 436 payments totaling approximately \$4 million. <u>General Fund and School Lunch</u> - back on track. The increase in the expenditure line for both funds is due to invoices being processed on a weekly basis. <u>Special Aid</u> - there are 9 grants approved; 7 grants under review. <u>Treasurer's Report</u> - all accounts have been reconciled.

IX. POLICY REVIEW

The following policies were reviewed by Policy Committee at its October 21, 2014 meeting. Mr. Carmello stated we accepted NYSSBA's recommendations for updates and will abolish several policies because they are covered in another policy or are procedural in nature, no policy is necessary. These policies will be approved at the December 3rd meeting.

1. Benetech Inc. - Affordable Care Act Consulting Agreement

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent, hereby accepts an Affordable Care Act Consulting and Administrative Services Agreement between the Troy City School District ("Plan Sponsor") and Benetech Inc. ("Benefits Plan Manager") to provide consulting and administrative services in connection with the Affordable Care Act ("ACA") for a 3-year term effective October 1, 2014 through September 30, 2017 at a cost of \$13,650 per year to be paid from the General Fund.

2. <u>Cooperative Energy Purchasing Service (NYSMEC) for Natural Gas</u> (Addendum IV)

WHEREAS, article 5-G of the New York State General Municipal Law authorizes municipal corporations to enter into cooperative agreements for the performance or exercise of services, functions, powers or activities on a cooperative or contract basis among themselves or one for the other, and

WHEREAS, Section 119-n of the General Municipal Law defines the term "municipal corporation" for the purposes of Article 5-G as a county outside of the city of New York, a city, a town, a village, a board of cooperative educational services, a fire district or a school district;

WHEREAS, the Troy City School District (hereinafter sometimes referred to as "Participant") is a "municipal corporation" as defined above; and

WHEREAS, this Board wishes for this municipal corporation to become or remain a Participant pursuant to the Municipal Cooperation Agreement for Energy Purchasing Services dated the 1st day of May, 2005 (the "Agreement"), among the municipal corporations collectively identified as the New York School and Municipal Energy Consortium ("NYMEC") upon the terms of the Agreement and further wishes to authorize participation as an energy consumer as specified below.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board hereby determines that it is in the interests of the Troy City School District (hereinafter "Participant") to participate in the NYSMEC, and authorizes and directs to sign the Agreement and/or the Billing Schedule for natural gas on its behalf; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Board authorizes the Administrative Participant (as defined in the Agreement) to prepare, advertise, disseminate and open bids pursuant to the General Municipal Law and to award, execute and deliver binding contracts on behalf of this Board for the purchase amount of natural gas for this Participant to the lowest responsible bidder as is determined by the Administrative Participant at a commodity price not to exceed \$1.141 cents per therm for a term of at least one year and no more than three years commencing May 1, 2015, and other terms and conditions, all as may be determined by the Administrative Participant, or to reject any or all such bids; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Participant agrees to advertise said bid as may be directed by the Administrative Participant; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the officers and employees of Participant are authorized to execute such other confirming agreements, certificates and other documents and take such other actions as may be necessary or appropriate to carry out the intent of this resolution.

This resolution shall take effect immediately.

3. Surplus Equipment

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent, hereby accepts the recommendation to surplus a total of (10) Ovens from Troy Middle School and Troy High School which shall be scrapped.

5. <u>Cooperative Energy Purchasing Service (NYSMEC) for Electricity</u> (green sheet)

WHEREAS, Article 5-G of the New York State General Municipal Law authorizes municipal corporations to enter into cooperative agreements for the performance or exercise of services, functions, powers or activities on a cooperative or contract basis among themselves or one for the other, and

WHEREAS, Section 119-n of the General Municipal Law defines the term "municipal corporation" for the purposes of Article 5-G as a county outside the city of New York, a city, a town, a village, a board of cooperative educational services, a fire district or a school district; and

WHEREAS, Troy City School District (hereinafter sometimes referred to as "Participant") is a "municipal corporation" as defined above; and

WHEREAS, this Board wishes for this municipal corporation to become or remain a Participant pursuant to the Municipal Cooperation Agreement For Energy Purchasing Services dated the 1st day of May 2005 (the "Agreement"), among municipal corporations collectively identified as the New York School and Municipal Energy Consortium ("NYSMEC") upon the terms of the Agreement and further wishes to authorize participation as an energy consumer as specified below.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that this Board hereby determines that it is in the interests of the Troy City School District to participate in the NYSMEC, and authorizes and directs the Board President to sign the Agreement/and or the Billing Schedule and Agreement for electricity on its behalf; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Board authorizes the Administrative Participant (as defined in the Agreement) to prepare, advertise, disseminate and open bids pursuant to the General Municipal Law and to award, execute and deliver binding contracts on behalf of this Board for the purchase of electricity for this Participant to the lowest responsible bidder as is determined by the Administrative Participant at a commodity price not to exceed \$.1126 cents per kWh for a term of at least one year and no more than three years commencing May 1, 2015, and other terms and conditions, all as may be determined by the Administrative Participant, or to reject any or all such bids; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Participant agrees to advertise said bid as may be directed by the Administrative Participant; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the officers and employees of this Participant are authorized to execute such other confirming agreements, certificates and other documents and take such other actions as may be necessary or appropriate to carry out the intent of this resolution.

This Resolution shall take effect immediately.

- Mary Marro-Giroux She attended the Communications workshop which was very valuable. Topics included: handling a crisis and having a communications plan in place; relationships with public officials is important during crisis situations. Also attended "Mental Health in Schools: Essential for Safe and Successful Learning Communities". Ms. Marro-Giroux stated that having a mental health professional in the school is important (School 2 has this); Data-driven disciplines.
- 2. Anne Wager-Rounds She was the voting delegate at the Annual Meeting. Discussion included Common Core. She also attended "New Dimensions in Learning" and 3D learning for enhanced science experiences, Troy is ready for next level of learning. Convention was very interesting.
- 3. Carol Harvin attended "College and Career Ready" workshop and learned that some students are not ready for college. Everyone deserves a quality education; potential is universal but opportunity is not.
- 4. Ann Apicella She attended "School, Business and Higher Education Collaborations: P-Tech Model". Troy is 1 of 16 districts in P-Tech program. 9th grade students will have a regents diploma and an associates degree. Mr. Carmello added that TMS has a great program and 4 districts are coming to visit our P-Tech program. There were 134 families in attendance at last night's P-Tech information night - these students will become Cohort 2.
- Bill Strang He attended ABCs of Graduating At-Risk Students. LaFayette High School participated in a project-based learning model which increased student graduation rates. Washington/Hamilton BOCES discussed students who fall through the crack; similar program putting students on track using AAS degree program at Adirondack Community College.
- Tom Mayo He attended workshop on "Student Discipline Making It Work". There are different steps to collaborate, involving family and school personnel. He also attended "Inspecting What You Expect: Evaluating the Performance of Your Superintendent". Troy is using the same evaluation tool.

Mr. Carmello thanked the Board members for attending the NYSSBA convention which provided valuable information.
