III. EXECUTIVE SESSION

At 5:15 pm Mr. Schofield made a motion to move to Executive Session for the purpose of discussing a pending litigation. This was seconded by Mr. Strang and carried 9-0. Invited to attend were Mr. Carmello, Dr. Watson, Ms. O'Neill, Mrs. Miaski and Mrs. O'Grady-Parent.

IV. PUBLIC SESSION

At 6:05 pm Mr. Schofield called the meeting to order with the Pledge of Allegiance.

V. PUBLIC INPUT ON AGENDA AND NON-AGENDA ITEMS

No public comments.

NON-ACTION ITEMS

VI. PRINCIPAL'S PRESENTATION - J. CANFIELD

Mr. James Canfield, Principal of the Alternative Learning Program at School 12, gave a presentation. The ALP program serves 100 students in Grades 7-12. Grades 7 and 8 self-contained classes were recently added. The purpose of the program is to help students deal with lack of hope, absenteeism, court system and mental health issues. Mr. Canfield asked students enrolled in the program for feed back. Students say that "our teachers really care" and "we have more success because teachers push us to get our work done."

How ALP accomplishes our purpose: Strong relationships with students, home visits, daily morning meetings with staff, in-take meetings with flexible times, committed to APEX program, afterschool tutoring, student cell phones are collected at the door, community art program and basketball.

The ALP difference is small class size, attendance accountability, employment training, APEX courses, Regents review. This has contributed to decrease in suspensions from 185 last year to 60 suspensions this year. Nine students are on track to graduation.

VIII. P-TECH GRANT UPDATE - D. WATSON

Dr. Donna Watson, Assistant Superintendent for Curriculum and Instruction, reported on the P-Tech Grant awarded to the District. Troy is 1 of 16 schools across NYS to have this grant. It is a 6-year program of college level study and 300 students will receive a regents diploma and HVCC degree putting them first in line for employment opportunities. We are identifying the first co-hurt of 30 students to start in September. 53 students have made preliminary applications and selection will be competitive. There was a parent meeting at the Middle School on March 18th which was well-attended by approximately 100 people.

VII. BUDGET PRESENTATION - J. CARMELLO

Mr. Carmello presented Draft 3 of the 2014-15 budget. The budget must be looked at through two lenses: Educational and Financial. The goal is to have the least impact on student programs as possible. At that same time we need to close the gap and be good stewards of the taxpayers' money.

<u>Draft 3</u> - Draft 1 showed the budget at \$109,463,762 with levy increase of 27.21%. Draft 2 showed the budget at \$109,463,762 with a levy increase of 20.36%. Adjustments to Draft 3 resulted in a budget of \$105,797,794 with a levy increase of 9.64%. There was a savings in Transportation of \$372,023; Retirement \$400,000; Reduction in Debt Service \$80,000; Health Insurance rate change \$213,023; Charter School reduction \$1,242,112 and the Ark Charter School reduction \$1,358,810.

<u>Charter Schools</u> - Charter school projections are at the current tuition rate. Last year we estimated a 20% increase but only saw 6% increase. Currently we estimate 10% for next year. Tuition rates for charter schools was frozen but there is a bill that could change this; but not yet confirmed. We would be looking at \$2000 less that would mean \$1.7 million in savings. It was announced the Ark Charter School will close in June. There are 112 students enrolled at Ark and we estimate that half will come back to Troy Schools. We are planning an outreach event to Ark families at the Troy Middle School. Mr. Schofield added that the savings from the Ark will allow for staff needed when students return to Troy.

<u>Advocacy Efforts</u> - Mr. Carmello, Ms. Denio and Mr. Strang attended Lobby Day and met with 4 legislators. They delivered over 1,700 letters and we are hopeful our efforts will yield positive results. State aid is less than half of our revenue and the burden falls on taxpayers; 59% of property owners in the District are tax-exempt. The Governor misstated enrollment reduction at 10%; Troy is actually down only 3%. However, we have reduced staff by 18% over the past five years. Foundation aid effectively has had no increase since 2008 despite rising mandated costs. Mr. Carmello hopes to have State Aid numbers by next workshop. Mr. Schofield suggested the 3/26 workshop be postponed to 3/31 to allow for State Aid information and Charter School tuition rate. <u>Next workshop meeting will be rescheduled to 3/31</u>.

Ms. Marro-Giroux asked about Ark families moving their children out of their elementary catchment area. Mr. Carmello explained this would cause major transportation issues. Last year he authorized School Choice into School 2 as well as out of School 2.

VIII. TREASURER'S REPORT - K. CIETEK

<u>February Financials</u> - Ms. Cietek stated the Hakimian Remainder Unitrust provided a donation for technology in the high school. Lunch Fund and School Dinner will now appear in the reports. All accounts have reconciled. There were no questions.
