III. EXECUTIVE SESSION

Mr. Schofield made a motion to move to Executive Session for the purpose of pending litigation to be discussed with our school attorney. Invited in were Mr. Carmello, Dr. Watson, Ms. O'Neill, Mrs. Miaski and Mrs. O'Grady-Parent.

IV. PUBLIC SESSION

At 7:00 pm Mr. Schofield called the meeting to order with the Pledge of Allegiance.

V. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Mr. Carmello reported that the 2014-15 will be adopted on tonight's agenda. This is the first time in five years there will be no cuts in programs or staff. He thanked the Board and Citizens Advisory Committee for their help in developing the budget.

VI. PUPIL PERSONNEL SERVICES/SPECIAL EDUCATION REPORT

Kathleen Burns, Director of Pupil Services, gave a powerpoint presentation. She stated the District offers a continuum of services and afforded opportunities to all students in Grades K-12. These services include a consultant teacher, resource room, integrated co-teaching and special education classes in district, BOCES and private schools.

We are committed to education Troy students and recently changed special class options in the elementary schools to 12:1:1; 12:1:2; 8:1:1; and 8:1:2. Classes with 8:1:1 and 8:1:2 ratios are for students with emotional needs. Special education in the secondary schools give students options for graduation. Classes are 12:1:1; 12:1:2; 15:1; 15:1:1 and 8:1:2. All instructional focus is geared to the Common Core achieved by either adaption or scaffolding.

Mr. Carmello added that the Futures study indicated we had too many students out-of-district for services. That has changed and students are now educated in Troy. Ms. Burns reported on several initiatives such as the Professional Development Specialist in the District four days a week, emphasis on literacy and reading instruction, consistent procedures for identification of students with the coordination of Response to Intervention and TACD. We are fortunate to have professional development through our regional special education and instruction services provider as well as support for students in self-contained classes.

Mr. Carmello thanked Ms. Burns for coming out of retirement and doing a great job as Director for the past two years. Pupil Services/Special Education are in a much better place because of her hard work.

Mrs. Wager-Rounds said she learned that the Professional Development Specialist was provided by the State at no cost. Ms. Burns said PD Specialist is a wonderful asset and teachers depend on her services.
