III. EXECUTIVE SESSION

At 5:30 pm Mr. Schofield made a motion to move to Executive Session regarding a two contractual matters. Invited in were Mr. Carmello, Dr. Watson, Ms. O'Neill, Mrs. Miaski and Ms. Ahearn.

IV. PUBLIC SESSION

At 6:00 pm Mr. Schofield called the meeting to order with the Pledge of Allegiance.

V. PUBLIC INPUT ON AGENDA AND NON-AGENDA ITEMS

NON-ACTION ITEMS

VI. NYS TEST SCORES REPORT - J. CARMELLO AND D. WATSON

Mr. Carmello reported that we are on our way to having Common Core in every classroom, every day. We are where we need to be. He explained that the data goal is used to make decisions. Training has been done to use data to made these decisions, including hiring teachers based on evidence. We are looking forward to starting the new school year with trained staff.

The District is excited because we are turning around School 2 with new leadership and new staff which will take the school to a whole new level. We are phasing into Common Core. Originally is was set at 7 year period but has been extended to 12 years. The Class of 2022 will be the first cohort to graduate to prove our aspirational goals.

NYS Assessment Results - ELA scores across NYS were reported to be less than 1/3 and no change in Troy since last year. Math scores have shown a good jump.

<u>District Goal 1</u> was discussed to increase proficiency on Grades 3-8 ELA and Math scores by 20%. We did not reach targeted goal but there was growth at Troy in the number of students district-wide who scored at the proficiency levels (3 or 4) which increased by 31% on the ELA Exam (Grades 3-8) and by 12% in Math (Grades 3-8) assessments. Mr. Carmello compared first-year progress with the new standards. We are making growth but this will take time. He stated that all students WILL learn and achieve at high levels. If they don't, we WILL change what we do. School leaders will support teachers and staff to ensure that they have what they need to meet the needs of our students. Data will be used to inform all of the work that we do. Mr. Carmello would like to keep goal at 20% even though we fell short because we are making good progress.

Dr. Watson explained <u>Poverty and Performance</u> - We say students can learn and Troy believes that "Demography is not Destiny". Just because you are poor does not mean you cannot be successful. There is a relationship with poverty; however we can still have students at Levels 3 and 4. District goals will continue as part of 5-year plan to improve student levels.

Dr. Watson discussed the Code of Conduct in relation to <u>District Goal 2</u>. Revisions will be made to reflect a District-wide belief that "This code is founded upon a firm believe that the best conduct always begins with strong, positive relationships between students, families and all people who work for the Troy City School District" We will operate with a growth mindset - building on strengths and expecting the best from everyone. The Board will receive a report on Goal 2 results in September.

Operationizing the Regions Reform Agenda. Troy's theory of action is that all Troy student will learn and achieve at high levels. If they don't we will change what we do to ensure that students do learn. Student leaders support teachers and staff to ensure they have what they need to meet the needs of our students. Data will be used to inform all of what that we do.

Rigorous Common Core State Standards - high quality, embedded professional development; upgraded core reading program aligned to CCSS; use of NYS curriculum modules for ELA and Math; Adopts of QIII (K-8) basement assessments; development of 4-year curriculum management state; adoption of new CCLS-based report card; and elementary schedule built around ELA, Math and daily intervention. Dr. Watson showed the new Elementary Master Schedule with its new CCLS focus. This schedule has the potential to dramically change the amount of time for students to be challenged and increase time for intervention.

<u>Discussion</u> - Ms. Marro-Giroux asked about teacher professional development. Dr. Watson said PD is intense and we are re-certified each year. Administrators are doing a great job with evaluations; providing teacher with honest feedback. It is a culture of empowerment, not punitive. Data systems drive decision-making. RTI is on-going. Mr. Schofield asked if Ark students are in need of more help. Ark students are all within range and we will assess all new students. Dr. Watson added that the District has hired highly qualified staff.

School 2 Turnaround - School 2 is a SIG priority school. It is a teaching and learning laboratory. There are many changes this year to provide a safe and welcoming environment. Dr. Fantroy-Ford is the interim Principal and Mr. Meadows is the new Principal Assistant. There is a succession plan for Ms. Turner to be Principal in July 2015. Mrs. Harvin asked if a few students are high poverty level, would it take way from other students? Dr. Watson said the new master schedule shows intervention and additional classroom supports. We have been strategic with our resources. Mrs. Harvin said Dr. Watson has done an excellent job.

Mrs. Wager-Rounds asked if we can help our parents better understand it. The Middle School had a great response and we should replicate this. Dr. Watson said the District has to do a better job with parent feedack. We need to talk with our graduates to see how we are doing.

VII. TREASURER'S REPORT - K. CIETEK

<u>June Financials</u> - Ms. Cietek reported that transfers are primarily related to year-end close out. Despite free lunch this past school year, the School Lunch Fund has a balance of \$160,000. We are plan to purchase equipment and create additional serving lines in the high school with a portion of fund balance. General Fund - \$127,000 used in unappropriated fund balance. Special Aid - All expenditure reports have been completed for grants ending June 30, 2014. Treasurer's Report - It was previously reported that all accounts were reconciled.

<u>July Financials</u> - Claims auditor reviewed 462 payments total approximately \$7.9 million. General Fund -We are in the process of encumbering funds for blanket purchase orders and annual reoccurring expenses. In September we will begin payroll encumbrances; you will see an increase in the budget transfers due to staffing moves. Treasurer's Report - All accounts have been reconciled.

We expect the letter in October from our auditors, Cusack & Company.

VIII. POLICY REVIEW - J. CARMELLO

Mr. Carmello reported that the Policy Committee met in June 24th and July 22nd to review policies for updates. Mr. Tuttman has some questions regarding Policy 4810 so this policy will be tabled until the next workshop.
