I. MEETING CALLED TO ORDER

At 5:30 pm Mr. Schofield called the meeting to order.

III. EXECUTIVE SESSION

Mr. Schofield made a motion at 5:30 pm to move to Executive Session regarding pending litigation. Invited into Executive Session were Mr. Carmello, Dr. Watson, Mr. Hotaling, Ms. Miaski and Mrs. O'Grady-Parent.

IV. PUBLIC SESSION AND DISTRICT NEWS

At 6:00 pm Mr. Schofield called the meeting to order with the Pledge of Allegiance. Mr. Schofield shared the following news: Troy will host a Career Expo on October 22nd; Troy Riverfront P-Tech students were featured in a television commercial; School 2 welcomed Troy Public Library and Rensselaer County Literacy Volunteers to a recent P.R.O.M.I.S.E. event and School 16 will have Family Pasta Night on November 3rd. Mr. Carmello added that Section II is requiring \$6 admission fee for sectionals - unfortunately this includes students.

VI. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT - J. CARMELLO

Mr. Carmello said he recently attended the annual NYSSBA Convention in NYC with Board members. October 26-30, 2015 is Board Recognition Week and he thanked the Board for their service. Elementary students prepared cards of appreciation. Mr. Carmello provided Board members with a Governor's proclamation.

VII. SCHOOL 16 PRINCIPAL PRESENTION - T. FORD

Dr. Tracy Ford presented on the progress made at School 16 which has shown increased proficiency since 2012. School 16 was identified as a school in Good Standing for 2015-16 and LAP Designation for Special Education has been removed. School 16 has shown growth on New York State assessments in 2014-2015 with 24.8% ELA Proficiency for Grades 3–5 and 39.9% Math proficiency. Students are believing in themselves. Discipline data also demonstrated improvement with fewer incidents and suspensions.

Dr. Ford stated that School 16's goals are aligned with district expectations of increased academic achievement. He noted that School Turnaround efforts include teacher leadership such as Literacy Coach, Math and ELA Curriculum Leaders, RTI/PST Team, Technology Committee, Building Safety Committee and School Leadership Team. He thanked the Board and his staff for their support.

Mrs. Wager-Rounds said she was very happy to hear that School 16 changed their school colors to purple and gold.

VIII. TREASURER'S REPORT - K. CIETEK

Ms. Kathleen Cietek, District Treasurer, reported on the September 2015 financials. She stated that budget transfers were related to encumbering of BOCES services and development of individual curriculum budgets for the curriculum leaders. The internal claims auditor reviewed 406 checks totaling \$3.1 million.

The General Fund is on target to hit our revenues and expenditures. Lunch Fund has an increase in the unestimated revenue category due to a refund check from Sodexo for 2014-15. Special Aid fund has (6) grants approved and (7) under review.

Ms. Cietek reported on the Treasurer's Report that all accounts have been reconciled.

<u>Discussion</u> - Mr. Schofield asked how the District handles uncashed checks. Ms. Cietek explained that 3-4 letters are sent, the final letter via certified mail. The District accounts for uncashed checks for 7 years. Mr. Hotaling added the District is not required to file as "unclaimed funds" and money can go back into the general fund after that time.

IX. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

<u>Policy Review</u> - Mr. Carmello reported on two policies reviewed by the Committee on September 29th.

6640 Accounting of Fixed Assets and Inventories - Threshold was increased from \$500 to \$1000. All technology valued at \$150 or more is inventoried.

6700 Purchasing - "Piggybacking" language has been added to allow us more buying power.
