### IV. PUBLIC SESSION AND DISTRICT NEWS

Mr. Schofield called the meeting to order with the Pledge of Allegiance. He made the following announcements regarding District events: (1) District Art Show was held at the Troy Atrium. Select students in Grades K-12 had their works displayed and a formal awards ceremony was held. (2) NYS Regent Josephine Finn visit our Troy Riverfront P-Tech Program at THS.

### **NON-ACTION ITEMS**

### VI. PRINCIPAL'S PRESENTATION - J. CANFIELD

Mr. James Canfield, Principal of Alternative Learning Program (ALP) introduced his staff. He has adopted the philosophy of the Efficacy Institute and it has been included in their professional development. "Every mind and every heart" means that every student counts. Students get 100% from ALP staff. Students in the program have to work harder and have to catch up. The ALP progr serves 130 students in Grades 7-12; approximately 30% increase from 2013-14. Program starts at 8:30 am and ends at 6:00 pm: Alternative Learning Program (day program) serves 55-65 students; Special Education/Self-Contained for Grades 9-12 serves 30-35; and additional prescript support for Grades 7-12 to support social and behavioral needs (approximate 15-20 students). Also THS and TI suspension program is held here from 1 to 3 pm.

ALP purpose is to provide an environment to motivate students to reach their full potential and strive proficiency. Primary goal to graduate students from high school. ALP students have challenges (ex violence, teen parents, homelessness and lack of hope). Students feel supported here and the committed staff are "guardian of hope". Staff meetings are held every morning and every afternoon. There is parent in-take and staff does home visits. ALP difference: smaller classes, co-teaching, attendance accountability, differentiated instruction, employment training and regents review. Mr. Canfield shared examples of successes in his program and two students explained what the ALP program means to them.

#### VII. TREASURER'S REPORT - K. CIETEK

<u>March Financials</u> - Kathleen Cietek, District Treasurer reported on that the majority of budget transfer for March were salary-related. The internal claims auditor reviewed 417 checks totaling \$6.5 million <u>School Lunch Fund</u> - School 2 playground has been installed and the THS service line is on schedule for installment over the summer. <u>Special Aid</u> - all grants have been approved and a request for func from SED were submitted in April. <u>Treasurer's Report</u> - all accounts have been reconciled.
