III. **EXECUTIVE SESSION**

Mr. Schofield made a motion at 6:00 pm to move to Executive Session to discuss pending litigation matters. Invited in were Mr. Carmello, Dr. Watson, Mr. Blanchfield and Ms. Ahearn.

IV. PUBLIC SESSION AND DISTRICT NEWS

At 7:00 pm Mr. Schofield called the meeting to order with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mr. Schofield announced that School 14 students collected money for Make-A-Wish; RPI Science Ambassadors visited Troy Middle School classes; School 2 will celebrate their new playground on Saturday, May 9th. Mr. Carmello added that the Coaches vs. Cancer fundraiser is Friday, May 8th and Mr. Mastrosky's 9-year son has won his battle with cancer and will throw the first pitch at this event.

V. PUBLIC INPUT ON AGENDA AND NON-AGENDA ITEMS

No public comment.

VI. BUDGET HEARING

Superintendent John Carmello reported on the 2015-16 proposed budget. The Board has recommended a budget of \$108,163,850 with a tax levy of 2.49%. This is \$90,000 below the tax cap and a modest increase of a 1.29% from the current year's budget. He stated the budget is fiscally responsible and has been reviewed thoroughly for savings that would not impact students. State aid has been maximized. The budget is also educationally sound and focused on getting Troy students college and career ready.

For the first time in many years, Troy is able to enhance our educational program; add support services, add to athletics/extracurricular activities, maintain our extensive Advanced Placement and College in the High School offerings. There was an active lobbying campaign with our Legislators and these efforts resulted in \$500,000 increase to Foundation Aid and \$1.1 million restoration of GEA. This additional money helped make it possible to add supports and programs that our students, while maintaining a reasonable tax levy increase.

We have once again stayed within our tax cap and will have an Efficiency Plan ready for approval. We expect our taxpayers to have a rebate check in the fall, like last year, which matches the amount of increase in the tax bill due to the new tax levy. This effectively results in no increase in the property taxes for our taxpayers for next year.

Mr. Carmello said that if the budget is voted down, there are new SED regulations that require 0% tax levy increase on a contingency budget. This would require an additional \$877,275 in expenditure cuts and could result in reductions in personnel and programs. In closing, he stated that he is excited about the future of the Troy School District and proud of all the great things going on in our schools. This budget will allow us to continue to move the District forward.
