III. EXECUTIVE SESSION

Mr. Schofield made a motion at 5:30 pm to move to Executive Session regarding pending litigation. Invited in were Mr. Carmello, Dr. Watson, Mr. Blanchfield, Mrs. Miaski and Ms. Ahearn.

IV. PUBLIC SESSION

At 6:15 pm Mr. Schofield called the public session to order with the Pledge of Allegiance.

V. PUBLIC INPUT ON AGENDA AND NON-AGENDA ITEMS

NON-ACTION ITEMS

VI. NYS TEST SCORES REPORT - J. CARMELLO AND D. WATSON

Mr. Carmello gave an overview of the Regents Reform Agenda. He stated that the Board of Regents adopted more rigorous college and career readiness standards. 2013 was the first year ELA and Math scores were tied to new assessments for Grades 3-8. We are now in the third year of higher standards. 2014 was the roll-out for more rigorous Regents exams. In 2017 students will be required to pass all 5 regents exams with 65% grade before they graduate. In 2022 the first cohort of high school graduates will be required to pass more rigorous regents exams for graduation at the aspirational college and career ready level. This cohort just completed 5th grade. Mr. Carmello reviewed the explanation for Levels 1-4 of proficiency. He clarified that Level 2 is not failing but shows that a student is partially on track to meet targets. He would like to see results higher but knows success will be demonstrated as incremental progress.

Mr. Carmello showed a chart of progression for state-wide proficiency performance. There was small improvement in ELA from 2013 to 2015 but Math had an improvement overall. Opting out was an issue this year as 20% of eligible students across New York did not take tests. Troy was much less with 8% ELA and 15% for Math; we did not reach 95% participation but many districts did not either. Questar Assessments has been contracted for future assessments, not Pearson. New SED Commissioner MaryEllen Elia is committed to Common Core and promised to be more collaborative.

<u>District Goals</u> - Mr. Carmello reviewed our current district goals. We are on track with Goal 4 regarding data driven decision-making and data driven instruction, which is criteria for new hires. With help from Technology Department, data will be drilled down to each student to see any red flags. Administrative Council will include review of data for 2015-16 school year. We are also on track with Goal 3 and recognized last year increase in graduation rates. Goal 2 regarding the Code of Conduct will continue to strive for a decrease in violations each year.

Goal 1 relates to achieving proficiency scores for Grades 3-8 which is judged by state-wide assessments. We have set our goal high and will work hard to reach it. Mr. Carmello does not want to lower goals and possibly leave a student behind. He showed the breakdown for students continuously enrolled in 2013-14 and 2014-15. There was an improvement for both ELA and Math for Levels 1 and 2, and even though we did not reach the goal, we were just short and should be proud. Our district-wide results in ELA and Math show continuous improvement over the last three years, with several areas of significant improvement School 16 had a significant jump from 25.3% to 39.9%. Dr. Tracy Ford and his faculty and staff were recognized for this accomplishment. All ELA scores increased except for School 18. Mr. Carmello and administration are monitoring results.

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Tuttman stated 20% improvement is a good target for ELA and Math, but he would like to see 100%. He is encouraged by 18% improvement shown. Mrs. Wager-Rounds congratulated Dr. Ford as well as Mr. Dunn on improved scores. Mr. Carmello added that Troy is below the state average but our movement is quicker than state average. We are making progress and will build upon our success.

Operationalizing the Regents Reform Agenda - Dr. Donna Watson continued the powerpoint presentation. The Regents Reform Agenda includes implementing common core standards, building instructional data systems, recruiting and retaining effective teachers and turning around low-achieving schools. Our "Theory of Action" in Troy since last year is that all students WILL learn and achieve at high levels. The 2015-16 school year has a new focus on efficacy and it will be the year of Self-Directed Improvement. Troy City School District has partnered with the Efficacy Institute who is providing professional development for every school. The impact of efficacy on student achievement has three components: (1) Mission - academic proficiency or higher and strong character for all children; (2) Mindset - people can in fact "get smart"; and (3) Method - Teach the Method and install a self-directed improvement system for effective use of data and feedback.

Dr. Watson explained the Curriculum Management Cycle for TCSD. We are in the second year of using Curricuplan electronic maps. Teachers are mapping out their curriculum to align to the standards and it becomes a central tool. By 2018 there will be a comprehensive map for all curricula. This is also the second year of a new elementary Master Schedule built around Common Core areas. We are using GURU boards for building instructional data systems. Staff will be getting extra time through early releases and team time to analyze data, feedback and strategy. We continue to recruit highly effective teachers and principals. School 2 has a renewed focus on efficacy and engaging the whole community (CET), development of plans to promote shared ownership for school improvement and a clear mission to get every student to proficiency and beyond.

<u>Discussion</u> - Mrs. Wager-Rounds said she would like teachers to understand that it is okay to share their ideas with each other. If something is working, let's share it. Dr. Watson said our district is filled with talented teachers - our students need us and there is no time to waste. She absolutely agreed that staff should be willing to share their best practices with each other.

Mr. Carmello concluded by saying September 2nd is opening day for faculty and staff.

VII. TREASURER'S REPORT - K. CIETEK

<u>June 2015</u> - Ms. Cietek reported that budget transfers for June were related to year-end close out. The internal claims auditor reviewed 505 checks totaling \$6.9 million. The General Fund, School Lunch and Special Aid funds are currently under review with out external auditors. <u>Treasurer's report</u> - all accounts have been reconciled.

<u>July 2015</u> - The internal claims auditor reviewed 246 checks in July totaling \$5.5 million. In the General Fun we are in the process of encumbering all re-occurring payments. School Lunch - we have been working with Mr. Wood (Sodexo) to encumber any necessary equipment and supplies for various buildings throughout the District. Special Aid had 8 grants under review. <u>Treasurer's Report</u> - all accounts have been reconciled.

1. School 1 - SEQRA Determination

Whereas, the Enlarged City School District of Troy ("School District") desires to embark upon the sale of former Public School 1 ("PS 1") located at 2920 Fifth Avenue in Troy, which the Board of Education has determined is no longer needed for educational purposes (the "proposed action"), and

Whereas, the proposed action is subject to classification under the State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQRA"); and

Whereas, the Board of Education contracted with the Chazen Companies to review the potential impact of the proposed action and to prepare an Environmental Assessment Form (EAF) for the proposed action,

Now, therefore, be it resolved, that the Board of Education of the Enlarged City School District of Troy shall serve as lead agency for the purpose of compliance with SEQRA and its implementing regulations at 6 NYCRR Part 617; and

Be it further resolved, that the Board of Education, as lead agency, hereby adopts the above-referenced EAF and agrees with the contents thereof; and

Be it further resolved, that upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools and the District's environmental consultant, the Chazen Companies, the Board of Education hereby determines that the proposed action is an Unlisted Action under the SEQRA regulations; and

Be it further resolved, that based upon the information contained in the EAF and all other relevant information before it, the Board of Education, as lead agency for the action contemplated herein, and after due deliberation and analysis, hereby determines that the proposed action will not result in significant adverse impacts to the environment, under the criteria set forth in 6 NYCRR §617.7, specifically:

- 1) The proposed action is not expected to have a significant effect on local air quality, ground or surface water quality or quantity, or traffic or noise levels.
- 2) The proposed action will not cause a substantial increase in solid waste production, or a substantial increase in the potential for erosion, flooding, leaching, or drainage problems.
- 3) The proposed action will not result in the removal or destruction of large quantities of vegetation or fauna, and is not expected to substantially interfere with the movement of any resident or migratory fish or wildlife species.
- 4) No disturbance to or substantial adverse effect on any identified significant habitat areas, threatened or endangered species of animal or plant, the habitat of such species, or other natural resources has been identified.

- 5) The proposed action will not result in the impairment or the environmental characteristics of a Critical Environmental Area.
- 6) The proposed action is not in material conflict with the community's current plans or goals as officially approved or adopted.
- 7) The proposed activity will not impair the character or quality of important historical, archaeological, or aesthetic resources or the existing community or neighborhood character. There is no anticipated significant adverse effect on local community services such as police and fire protection, or recreational and educational facilities.
- 8) The proposed action will not result in a major change in the use of either the quantity or type of energy.
- 9) The proposed action will not create a hazard to human health.
- 10) The proposed activity will not result in a substantial change in the use, or intensity of use, of land devoted to agricultural, open space, or recreational use.
- 11) The proposed action will not encourage or attract large numbers of people to a place or places for more than a few days, compared to the number of people who would come to such place absent the action.
- 12) The proposed action will not result in the creation of material demand for other actions that would result in one of the above consequences.
- 13) The proposed action will not result in changes in two or more elements of the environment, no one of which has a significant impact on the environment, but when considered together result in a substantial adverse impact on the environment.

Now, therefore, be it resolved, that the Board of Education of the Enlarged City School District of Troy hereby accepts the offer to purchase the School 1 property, received from Redburn Development Companies, LLC, in the amount of Three Hundred Fifteen Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$315,000.00), contingent upon the approval of the sale by the qualified voters of the Enlarged City School District of Troy at a public referendum; and

Be it further resolved, that the President of the Board of Education be and is hereby authorized to execute the Purchase and Sale Agreement with Redburn Development Companies, LLC, regarding the School 1 property, bearing the following tax map numbers on the tax rolls of the City of Troy, County of Rensselaer: Sec. 90.70 Block 7 Lot 1; Sec. 90.70 Block 7 Lot 5; Sec. 90.70 Block 7 Lot 14; and Sec. 90.70 Block 7 Lot 15,; and

Be it further resolved, that upon approval of the sale by the qualified voters of the District, the President of the Board of Education be and hereby is authorized to execute a deed(s) and any related documents necessary to convey said property at the time of closing pursuant to said Purchase and Sale Agreement; and

Be it further resolved, that the President of the Board of Education and the Superintendent of Schools are each authorized to execute any and all additional documents in furtherance of this transaction, including but not limited to matters before the City of Troy and County of Rensselaer.

3. Contract Extension - Durham School Services (2015-16)
