# I. Call to Order

At 5:15 pm Mr. Schofield called the meeting to order.

#### B. EXECUTIVE SESSION

Mr. Schofield made a motion at 5:15 pm to move to Executive Session regarding a personnel matter. Invited into Executive Session were Mr. Carmello, Dr. Watson, Mr. Hotaling, Ms. Miaski and Ms. Ahearn.

#### C. PUBLIC SESSION

At 6:00 pm Mr. Schofield called the meeting to order with the Pledge of Allegiance. Mr. Schofield presented a Certificate of Recognition to the family of former Board member Austin Devine. Mr. Devine served on the TCSD Board from 2002-04 and recently passed away.

# II. Non-Action Item

## A. School 2 Principal's Presentation - N. Turner-Hassell

Mrs. Turner-Hassell gave a power point presentation regarding School 2 which has been placed under Superintendent's Receivership status by SED. School 2 is focused on culture and climate to build a strong community as the foundation for academic achievement. They are moving "toward the mark" with social/emotional programs (student support team, school jobs, P.R.O.M.I.S.E., PBL and mentoring programs); as well as instruction (5 essential instructional practices, professional support afterschool, SMART goals, 80-minute efficacy planning meetings weekly). Mrs. Turner-Hassell indicated School 2 is progressing with the tremendous support and hard work of her staff.

Mr. Carmello made a follow up presentation specific to Receivership. The SIG grant will be extended but with reduced funding. Title I and general funds will be used to provide an extra monitor. Years 1 and 2 of grant school hours were until 4:00 pm, Year 3 (current) school hours are until 3 pm with a comprehensive afterschool program 3 days a week. Next year School 2 will return to 2:00 pm dismissal. Two quarterly reports have been submitted to SED to date. District must show demonstrable improvement with indicators selected by SED from two levels. Progress is measured from Levels 1 and 2 from an index range between 0% and 100%. If a school achieves an index of 67% or higher, the school has made demonstrable improvement. If the school does not show demonstrable improvement under the Superintendent's Receivership, an Independent Receiver will be assigned. Mr. Carmello is seeing positive results at School 2 and we will show demonstrable improvement.

<u>Discussion</u> - Mrs. Harvin said Mrs. Turner-Hassell is doing an excellent job. One-onone makes a huge different.

Mr. Schofield welcomed Mrs. Turner-Hassell back from maternity leave.

## B. Treasurer's Report - K. Cietek

Kathleen Cietek, District Treasurer reported on January financials. She stated budget transfers for January were minimal. We continue to transfer to special education tuition as students continue to move in and out of the District. The Internal Auditor reviewed 353 claims totaling approximately \$5 million.

Ms. Cietek anticipates using \$181,000 of our fund balance. In the upcoming months the Business Office will be reviewing outstanding purchase orders and making adjustments which could impact our next month's projection. In the School Lunch we anticipate using \$134,000 of our fund balance. Four new serving lines will be in installed at various elementary schools.

The Special Aid Fund is reviewing Learning Technology grant. All accounts have been reconciled. Mr. Carmello added he will be giving the Board an update on the Building Condition Surveys.

#### C. Superintendent's Report - J. Carmello

#### 1. Policy Review

Mr. Carmello reviewed two policies discussed at the Policy Committee meeting on November 17th. We will accept the updates made to Policy 5500. Policy 5450.1 as last updated in 1997. It is not a required policy and has been recommended for abolishment. Our school attorney confirmed this is acceptable as the District follows the law with regard to notification requirements.

### 2. 2016-17 Budget Development - Draft 2

Mr. Carmello presented Draft 2 of the proposed 2016-17 budget. The goal is to develop a budget that is both fiscally responsible and educationally sound. We know Troy taxpayers are overburdened with city taxes.

Draft 1 was \$109,590,960 with gap of \$1,192,517. <u>Draft 2 is \$109,716,960</u> with a gap under \$1.2 million. Revenue is \$108,398,443 leaving a budget gap of \$1,318,517. TRS rates were lower than expected but prescription rates are much higher. Gas and electric expenses vary but there are some savings this year.

Our allowable tax levy increase is .13%; Mr. Carmello recommends a tax levy of 0%. Tax cap is due to Comptroller's Office by March 1st. Mr. Tuttman is in favor of 0%.

<u>Advocacy Efforts</u> - We are waiting on State numbers to close the gap and our advocacy efforts are the best way to do this. Numerous efforts include Commissioner Elia's advocating for \$2.4 billion in aid, Maisto case, Small Successful City Schools Act, Chamber of Commerce initiative and Lobby Day. Mr. Carmello is cautiously optimistic that our efforts will yield positive results and the aid in the proposed Executive Budget will be significantly increased.

<u>Possible reductions for Draft 3:</u> closing School 12 pool which is used four times per year and costs \$100,000 per year to maintain; offering a retirement incentive; and change in charter school enrollment. At this point Tier 2 requests by administrators are left out unless state aid comes in. We will continue a thorough and comprehensive review of the budget.

<u>Budget Calendar</u> - Because we are in a holding pattern for state numbers, Draft 3 will not be presented at the March 16th workshop. We need to modify the budget calendar and hold the meeting on March 30 or April 5.
