# III. EXECUTIVE SESSION

At 6:01 pm Mrs. Wager-Rounds made a motion to move to Executive Session to discuss a pending litigation and a contractual matter. The motion was seconded by Mr. Strang and carried 9-0. Also invited in were Dr. Howard, Mr. Carmello, Ms. O'Neill, Ms. Miaski and Mrs. O-Grady-Parent. At 6:40 pm Dr. Howard, Mr. Carmello, Ms. O'Neill and Ms. Miaski were excused from Executive Session and BOE met with the school attorney until 7:05 pm regarding a contractual matter.

### IV. PUBLIC SESSION

At 7:10 pm the public session was called to order with the Pledge of Allegiance.

### V. DISTRICT COMMUNITY ANNOUNCEMENTS

On behalf of the Board of Education, Mrs. Rounds presented Doug Wolfe, who recently retired from Director of Food Services, with a certificate of appreciation. Mr. Wolfe has dedicated his professional and personal time to the students of Troy for many years. THS Parent Jeannie Steigler and School Nurse Ani Mooney also spoke regarding his many contributions to the Troy Booster Club and Nutrition Committee, respectively.

Dr. Howard presented NYSSBA certificates from School Board U Recognition Program to Mrs. Rounds, Mr. Mayo, Mrs. Harvin and Mr. Strang. Ms. Denio completed the required fiscal oversight training.

### VI. CAPITAL PROJECT UPDATE

Marc Rivers of U.W. Marx and Kersten Lorcher of Mosaic Associates gave a monthly update on the Capital Project. Lighting fixtures and doors are now in place at the Middle School site. The project is going smoothly accordingly to timeline. Mrs. Rounds would like the Board to tour the construction site.

### VII. PRINCIPAL'S PRESENTATION

Dr. Tracy Ford make a presentation to the Board regarding School 16. He recognized his staff and PS16 parents. The Board was given an overview of School 16's mission and vision. There are 393 students in Grades K-6; 16 new students were received from School Choice. School 16 has many programs and COMPASS Action Plan for school improvement. The public enjoyed a video of students in classroom settings. Dr. Howard added that last year was a turbulent year due to re-districting but School 16 is right on track.

### VIII. SUPERINTENDENT'S PRESENTATION

Dr. Howard reported that School 2 has been identified as a Priority School by SED. 84% of students are below proficiency level and this is unacceptable. We have an obligation to our students. As a Priority School, it is necessary to make a major "transformation" with profound changes to this school. The District was made aware of a possible grant known as "School Improvement Grant" (SIG) in the amount of \$4.5 million over three years. We have prepared a plan which has been submitted to SED and will know on April 1st if we are awarded.

Please note that if the District is not awarded the grant, there will be an impact on 2013-14 budget. A shift of funding and personnel from other schools will be required to support the transformation required at School 2

Dr. Howard also presented the demographics of our elementary schools based on free and reduced lunch. Troy has a good mixture of students. Poverty levels may make it difficult to improve student achievement, but it is not impossible and cannot be used as an excuse. He emphasized that if we aim high and raise expectations, we will get there. These improvements must be made.

### IX. PUBLIC INPUT ON AGENDA AND NON-AGENDA ITEMS

Mark Walsh (TTA President) - Congratulations to Dr. Ford for continuing a great tradition at School 16. Thank you to BOE for offering retirement incentive. He agrees with Dr. Howard that we have enough talent in the District to overcome our challenges. We are in the budget process now and people need to talk with their legislators about the impact it has on student education.
