B. EXECUTIVE SESSION

At 5:30 pm Mr. Schofield made a motion for Executive Session.

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C. PUBLIC SESSION

At 6:00 pm Mr. Schofield called the meeting to order with the Pledge of Allegiance.

D. PUBLIC INPUT ON AGENDA AND NON-AGENDA ITEMS NON-ACTION ITEMS

E. DISTRICT NEWS

Mr. Schofield read the following announcements: RPI Engineering Ambassadors will attend THS to discuss STEM; 60 THS juniors attended first Junior College Night; 63 students received NHS pins in ceremony; THS MasterMinds placed first in their league; good luck to THS students Julian Schlemmer and Mutaz Ali who will compete in the national "We the People" competition in Washington, DC.

II. Non-Action Item

A. 2015-16 District Goals: Baseline and Progress Data

Dr. Donna Watson, Assistant Superintendent of Curriculum and Instruction, gave a powerpoint presentation of baseline and progress for student data as an executive summary in response to 32 questions asked by the Board. She began with an explanation of Troy's "theory of action" stating our belief that all students WILL learn and achieve at high levels; if they don't WE will change what we do to ensure they do. Dr. Watson gave an overview of data as it relates to the District's 2015-16 goals.

Dr. Watson said we are focused on District Goal 1 beginning in PK to achieve proficiency. We are constantly assessing our students in Grades K-5 with a frequency of testing which include Questar pre/post ELA and Math; Reading Streets baseline unit tests, Fountas & Pinnell, Writing Pieces, Go Math chapter tests. Grades K-2 students are tested for letter naming and sound identification; Grades K-3 are tested for high frequency words. The District has hired David Abrams as an outside consultant to evaluate our assessments. School report cards are the tightest indicators for assessment levels. Data shows there is a significant drop in scores in first grade where we have the most rigorous curriculum and most expected growth. However, scores may drop because our students have varied range of skills set when they enter school.

Dr. Watson reviewed data for excessive absenteeism (more than 18 days). Troy is doing more home visits than ever and we send home letters. The High School's absenteeism is 1% and staff is doing a great job. Attendance in kindergarten is equally important.

We are working on increasing the number of students graduating with distinction. Honor roll data shows 60% of TMS students (average 84.5 or higher) and THS has 30-40% on high honor roll. Eighty-one percent of students are on track to graduation from THS.

Questions: (1) How many students take AP classes? There are 64 students (out of 1224 students); this does not include college classes. (2) Does first grade have enough support if that is where there is most growth? Teachers are deployed by reading level and support highest needs students, not necessarily by grade. (3) When suspension letters are sent, can parents come in to return students? School makes personal contact with parents before letters are sent. (4) Do two indicators flag a student needing intervention? All data migrates to one location so we know who is are risk for not meeting their target. (5) Could Board see a sample report of a student at risk? Sample will be sent in Friday report. Guidance Office collects data. "GURU" program implementation is almost complete so everyone will see all data at one time. (6) Do we track our students after graduation? We just purchased "Naviance" to track students after graduation.

Dr. Watson thanked the Board for their questions which are focused on our students. The District is using data to direct its decisions.

B. <u>Troy High Principal's Presentation</u>

THS Principal, Joseph Mariano Jr., gave a powerpoint presentation regarding the high school. He stated that THS's vision is to make provide a place where all students are inspired to achieve success. District goal is to increase regents diploma rate by 3% and students graduation with distinction by 5%. Mr. Mariano reported that in 2014-15 25% of graduates earned an advanced diploma. THS has numerous programs which foster success: AIS, P-Tech, Transitions, Sponsor-a-Scholar, Sunset Program and ALP. They also launched a new master schedule which gives increased time blocks of 80-minutes every other day for Algebra I, Algebra II and Geometry. Review Classes are helping to increase passing grades and rates have increased since 2013-14 with consistent growth. Suspension data shows a decrease by 21%.

Mr. Mariano reported that the graduation rate in 2015 was 78.17% and 5 year rate was 84.34%. Looking ahead, he is excited about 60 students in P-Tech 9th Grade program, Naviance, Expanding the distance learning opportunities, more collaboration with 8th grade teams to better program incoming Freshman and new course offerings in Visual Arts and Computer Science.

C. Treasurer's Report

Mr. Adam Hotaling, Assistant Superintendent for Business, reported on March financials. He stated that all spending was cut off on April 1st so we will have a better idea of year-end balances at the next meeting. The internal claims auditor reviewed 315 claims totaling \$4.3 million. All accounts have been reconciled.

D. Policy Review - J. Carmello

Mr. Carmello reported on policies reviewed by the Policy Committee in February. All policies were updated within the past two years but NYSSBA recommended additional changes that the Board will approve. Discussion of Policy 5420 will be postponed until the May meeting.
