B. EXECUTIVE SESSION

At 5:30 pm Mr. Schofield made a motion for Executive Session. This was seconded by Mr. Mayo and carried 7-0. Invited in were Mr. Carmello, Dr. Watson, Mr. Hotaling, Ms. Miaski and Ms. Ahearn.

At 6:00 pm Mr. Schofield called the meeting to order with the Pledge of Allegiance.

II. Non-Action Items

A. Alternative Learning Program (ALP) Presentation

Mr. James Canfield, Principal of the Alternative Learning Program at School 12, gave a powerpoint presentation. ALP serves approximately 140 students in Grades 7-12. Programs include Alternative Learning Program for Grades 8-10 (55-65 students); Special Ed/Self-Contained program for Grades 9-12 (30-35 students); Prescriptive Program for Grades 7-12 to support social and behavioral needs (approximately 40 students).

The purpose of the ALP is to motivate students to reach their full potential. ALP is a student recovery program. The District is pro-active to get students on track. Data shows more students are taking and passing the regents. APEX enrollment is encouraging; Superintendent's suspensions have decreased; 8 seniors will graduate in June; 2 in August ar 1 like to graduate next year. ALP at School 12 advantages are: prescriptive make up work for students in jeopardy of failing; individual progress monitoring; smaller environment; and extend class time. There is a strong focus on efficacy.

School 12 faculty and staff go the extra mile for their students. Unique programs include Thanksgiving dinner, Christmas lunch, girls group, prom dress assistance, basketball team, help with summer employment, monthly birthday celebrations, student recognition certificates, parent training workshop, home visits and more. Mr. Canfield thanked the Board for the new van which allows them to provide transportation for parents, make college visits, take students home from afterschool events, etc. Mr. Canfield's vision for the future is a blended learning community. He would like to see a common mode of dress, employment training program and additional business partnerships.

Several students came to the microphone to give testimonials regarding the impact ALP has had on their lives, such as: "teachers at School 12 understand me"; "before coming to School 12 I did not attend school at all"; "I overcame drugs and other issues. Teachers made me change and seek out help" and "I am a better person". Parents also spoke and stated their child will graduate because of the program at School 12. There should be more programs like ALP; there are great opportunities for students at School 12. Parents thanked Mr. Canfield and his staff. The presentation was concluded with a video "yearbook" of the Alternative Learning Program.

B. Treasurer's Report - S. Convers

Mrs. Sarah Conyers, District Treasurer, reported that budget transfers were primarily salary-related. We are consolidating equipment district-wide for year-end purchases. There were 3 claims totaling \$6.6 million.

General Fund - surplus projected to be \$989,423 (0.91% of the budget). School Lunch - projections remain the same as last month. Special Aid - Learning Technology grant is still under review as of the end of April, it will be approved in May.

Treasurer's Report - School Dinner has been added. The account is open and dinner program will be running through 21st Century program. All accounts have been reconciled.
