B. Executive Session

At 5:30pm, Mrs. Wager-Rounds made a motion to enter into executive session to discuss the employment of a particular person. Invited in was Mr. Carmello, Dr. Watson, Mr. Hotaling, Mr. Abbasi, Mr. Fasano and Mr. Barile. This was seconded by Mrs. Pompey-Conway and carried 5-0.

C. Public Session

At 6:04pm, Mrs. Wager-Rounds called the regular meeting to order with the Pledge of Allegiance. Mr. Miller did not attend the public meeting.

D. Public Input on agenda and non-agenda items non-action items:

II. Non-Action Items

A. State Assessment Update - J. Carmello and D. Watson

Mr. Carmello begins the update explaining that this year's update comes much later than previous years because the State had embargoed the data until a few weeks ago. He reviews the District's pre-pandemic ELA and Math assessment data which has been making steady, sustained progress for the last seven years. The State's post-pandemic proficiency for ELA shows a modest improvement, while the Math scores show a higher increase than the ELA. The Troy specific data for both ELA and Math results are both higher than the State's results as well as outperforming similar needs districts. Mr. Carmello said that it goes without saying that the support the Board gave to us during Covid by adding co-teachers, social workers, and many more have all helped to make

these results happen. He thanks the Board for their continued support and commitment in all of these initiatives. Mr. Carmello also explains that our high school graduation rates have been constantly increasing and we are very proud of these numbers. Troy's rates are above the State's graduation rates. He says that he is so proud to be a Superintendent of a District working so hard for kids so they can achieve at their maximum and promises that we won't lose our momentum and keep improving.

Dr. Watson continues the presentation explaining how we will keep the momentum moving forward with a focus on the 2023-2024 DCIP priorities: meeting social-emotional developmental health needs of students and families, prioritizing instruction, intervention and support to meet the demonstrated needs of the students; and prioritizing improving equity in opportunities and outcomes for all students. The student's social emotional health is being supported by counselors, social workers, psychologists, as well as embedded classroom management. The canine and equine therapy program has been expanded for PreK through Grade 12 are also areas of supporting social emotional health of our students. The second priority of instruction encompasses deep dives for specially-designed instruction, Data Liaisons are trained to lead the work, Instructional Coaches have refined focus on expert practice for our teachers. Embedded professional development with partners like TCRWP, Eureka Math, BOCES and special education consultants have really shown so much growth in our state results. Dr. Watson explains that a curriculum management cycle has been in place since 2014, so that every curriculum area is comprehensively reviewed every four years. The third priority focus is on equity with equity improvement cycles in each building, which are all measured through improving engagement, relevancy and cultural responsiveness, using attendance specialists to help engage families as partners as well as district survey revisions. She goes on to say that none of this would be possible without the Board's support which is much appreciated. Dr. Watson ends by saying the District will not stop until we are at 100% graduation rate and our students are all at level of proficiency.
